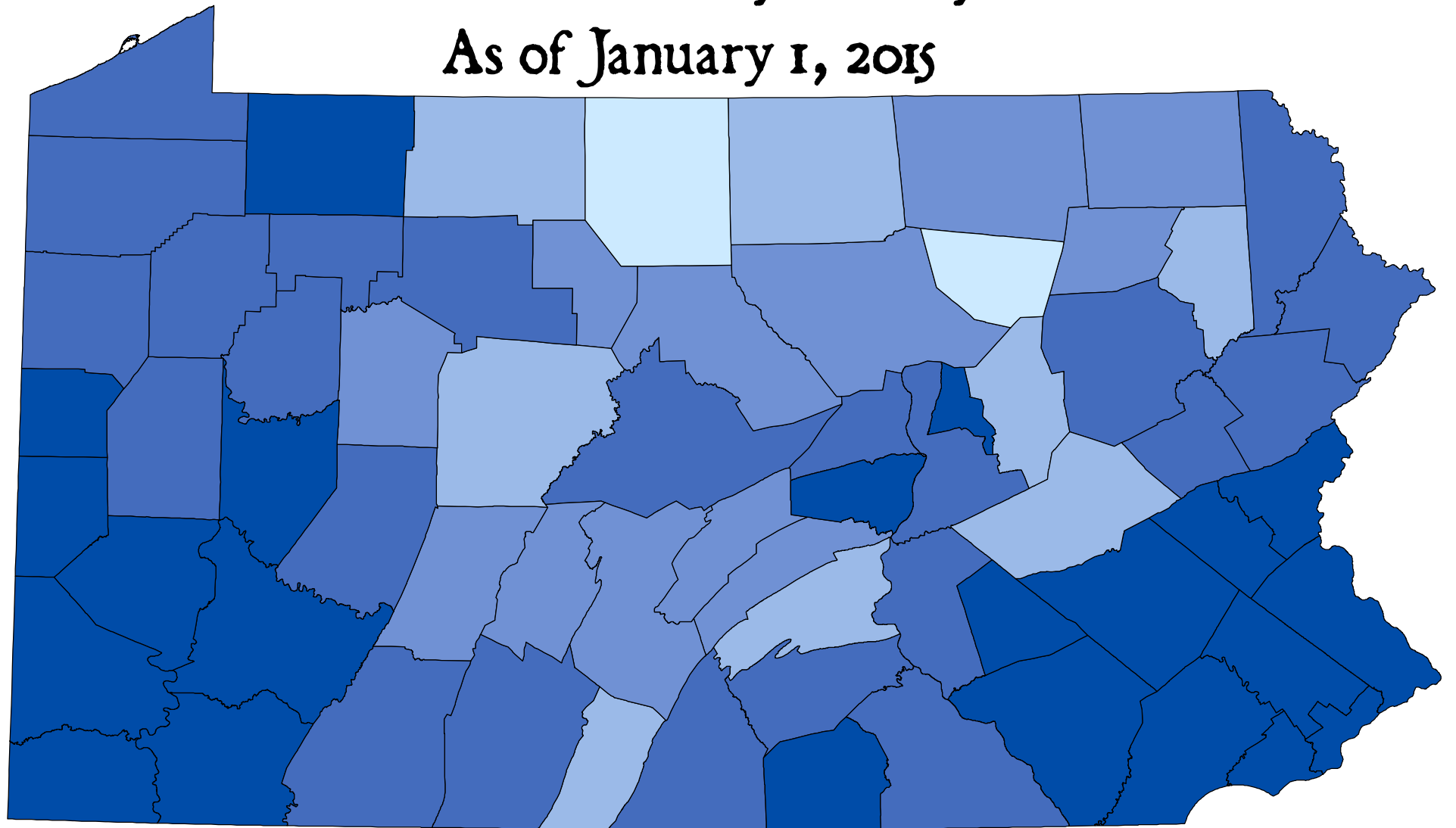

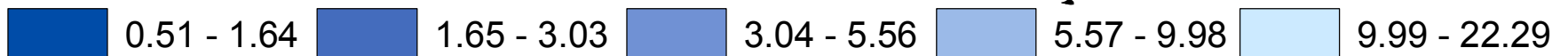
Site Densities by County
