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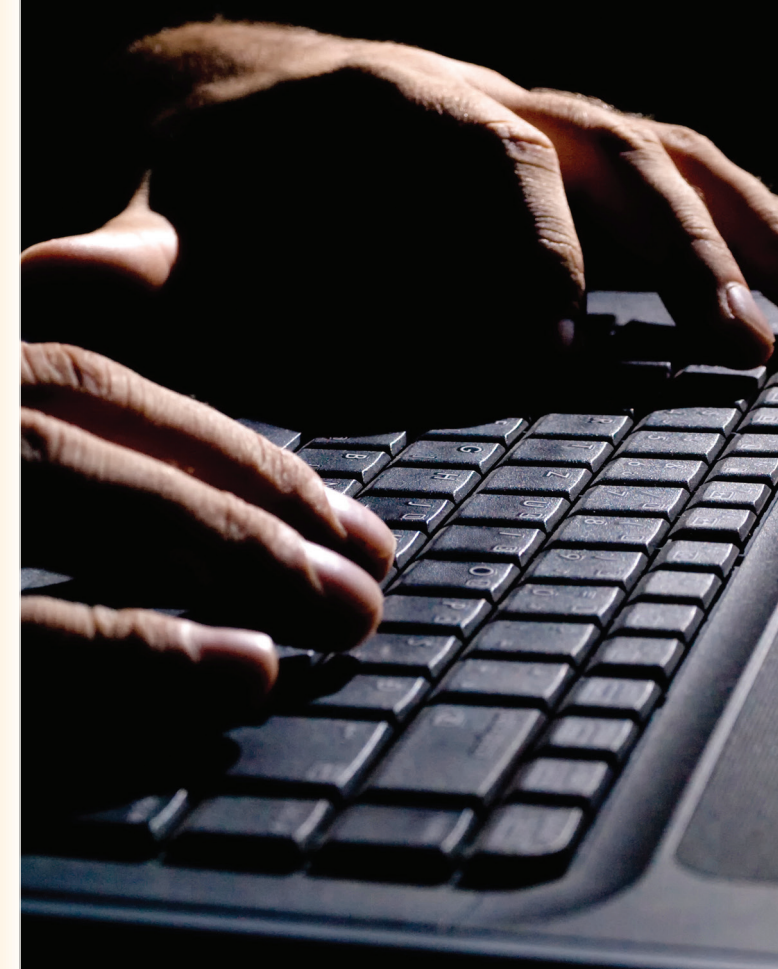

Our hope is that this program will increase the resources available to victims by enhancing the knowledge of attending providers.

**PROGRAM DESCRIPTION**

Technology saturates our everyday lives. Whether it is placing a call, using a cell phone, taking a digital photo, or logging onto a Social Network, an individual is potentially revealing some detail of their personal life. Technology has made our lives simpler but also makes it amazingly simple for a stalker or other criminal to uncover and use this information to stalk, hurt, or harass you. In addition, it has created numerous new challenges for police.

This is a unique and eye-opening class for prosecutors, attorneys, civil attorneys, law enforcement personnel, advocates, and other professionals who want to learn more about how everyday technologies are being used (or misused) to stalk, harass, or learn personal details about a person and their family. Not only will this class examine and demonstrate how individuals are unwittingly providing information about themselves and their activities, it will also reveal the ways perpetrators are accessing the information. However, most importantly, the training provides investigative tools and simple, inexpensive ways to help mitigate that loss and protect the information.

**LEARNING OBJECTIVES**

**At the conclusion of the class students will be familiar with:**

- Methods of cyber and digital stalking
- Digital photography metadata and covert video surveillance devices
- The vulnerabilities of Caller ID, including spoofing and unblocking software
- Using virtual numbers to safeguard personal phone number
- Cellular phone spyware and Smartphone application issues
- The dangers of GPS and geo-location technologies
- Social networking – essentials everyone needs to know

Although dealing with technology issues, this class is instructed in a manner that both the novice and the expert will understand and appreciate. The course utilizes a combination of lecture, multimedia examples, and live demonstrations involving the attendees. Evaluations of this course have been excellent and many have stated that it should be mandatory training for police officers and victim advocates.

**By attending this program attendees will be able to:**

- Understand methods of cyber and digital stalking and what equipment is available.
- Define digital photography metadata and its dangers as well as how to protect themselves.
- Increase awareness of covert video surveillance devices.
- Determine Caller ID spoofing and unblocking software as well as cell phone spyware and Smartphone application issues.
