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Revenue Department Releases April 2013 Collections

Harrisburg – Pennsylvania collected \$3.6 billion in General Fund revenue in April, which was \$31.7 million, or 0.9 percent, more than anticipated, Secretary of Revenue Dan Meuser reported today. Fiscal year-to-date General Fund collections total \$23.9 billion, which is \$67.2 million, or 0.3 percent, above estimate.

Sales tax receipts totaled \$752.4 million for April, \$64.8 million below estimate. Year-to-date sales tax collections total \$7.3 billion, which is \$309.2 million, or 4 percent, less than anticipated.

Personal income tax (PIT) revenue in April was \$1.9 billion, \$86 million above estimate. This brings year-to-date PIT collections to \$9.5 billion, which is \$113.8 million, or 1.2 percent, above estimate.

April corporation tax revenue of \$524.9 million was \$11.8 million below estimate. Year-to-date corporation tax collections total \$4.5 billion, which is \$243 million, or 5.7 percent, above estimate.

Inheritance tax revenue for the month was \$86.3 million, \$15.4 million above estimate, bringing the year-to-date total to \$670.1 million, which is \$31.6 million, or 4.5 percent, below estimate.

Realty transfer tax revenue was \$28.8 million for April, \$2.9 million above estimate, bringing the fiscal-year total to \$275.2 million, which is \$20.3 million, or 8 percent, more than anticipated.

Other General Fund tax revenue, including cigarette, malt beverage, liquor and table games taxes, totaled \$120.2 million for the month, \$6.8 million below estimate and bringing the year-to-date total to \$1.2 billion, which is \$46.6 million, or 4 percent, below estimate.

Non-tax revenue totaled \$165.8 million for the month, \$10.8 million above estimate, bringing the year-to-date total to \$426.3 million, which is \$77.5 million, or 22.2 percent, above estimate.

In addition to the General Fund collections, the Motor License Fund received \$274.7 million for the month, \$14.3 million above estimate. Fiscal year-to-date collections for the fund – which include the commonly known gas and diesel taxes, as well as other license, fine and fee revenues – total \$2 billion, which is \$29 million, or 1.5 percent, above estimate.
