

# Licensure Revocations:

The Department of Health, Division of Drug and Alcohol Program Licensure has the authority to refuse or revoke a license for the following reasons:

- (1) Failure to comply with a directive issued by the Department.
- (2) Violation of, or noncompliance with, the Department’s regulations for licensure and operation of a drug and alcohol facility.
- (3) Failure to comply with a plan of correction approved by the Department, unless the Department approves an extension of time to come into compliance or modification of the plan of correction.
- (4) Gross incompetence, negligence or misconduct in the operation of the facility.
- (5) Fraud, deceit, misrepresentation or bribery in obtaining or attempting to obtain a license.
- (6) Lending, borrowing or using the license of another facility.
- (7) Knowingly aiding or abetting the improper granting of a license.
- (8) Mistreating or abusing individuals cared for or treated by the facility.
- (9) Continued noncompliance with the Department’s regulations.
- (10) Operating a facility that, by nature of its physical condition, endangers the health and safety of the public.

If the Department proposes to revoke or refuses to issue a license, it will give written notice to the facility by certified mail, stating the reasons for the proposed action, and the specific time period for the facility to correct the deficiencies. Should the facility not correct the deficiencies within the specified time, the Department will officially notify the facility that the facility is required to show cause why its license should not be revoked under 1 Pa. Code § 35.14 (relating to orders to show cause), and that the facility has a right to a hearing. A request to the Department for a hearing shall be filed by the facility, in writing, within 30 days of receipt of the order to show cause under 28 Pa. Code § 709.17(c).

An administrative hearing will be convened and conducted for a facility pursuant to the provisions of 1 Pa. Code, Chapters 31, 33 and 35. If the hearing officer determines the testimony and evidence presented at the hearing substantiates noncompliance with the Department’s regulations and that revocation of the facility’s license is warranted, an Order is issued revoking the facility’s license.
