



JOINT COMMITTEE ON OLDER PERSONS WITH MENTAL RETARDATION

The Joint Committee on Older Persons with Mental Retardation (MR) was created in 1987 to promote collaboration between the Department of Public Welfare and the Department of Aging.

Mission Statement

Our mission is to promote dignity and quality of life as determined by the individual as well as full community inclusion for all older Pennsylvanians with mental retardation.

Personal Values

All older persons with mental retardation should be entitled to the following:

- A full range of choices, opportunities and options to obtain the quality of life they choose;
- Opportunities that include options for life-long growth and development appropriate for their changing needs;
- The opportunity to live at a maximum level of health, safety and self-sufficiency.
- Support in an environment which maximizes the autonomy, personal rights, dignity and uniqueness of each individual with sensitivity to personal, ethnic and cultural diversity.
- Recognition of caregivers as vital positive forces in the lives of people for whom they care. They should be afforded all the services and supports needed to effectively carry out their roles.

The Committee may include PA Dept. of Aging and Dept. of Public Welfare staff, county and provider staff from both service systems, advocates, educators, older individuals with mental retardation, their families and other interested parties.

Committee Functions

1. To develop, implement and evaluate goals and objectives based on shared values and our Mission Statement.
2. To collaborate on activities designed to enhance the quality of life and promote community inclusion for all older persons with mental retardation
3. To make recommendations to the Office of Developmental Programs and the PA Dept. of Aging concerning policies, inter-agency initiatives, innovative services, supports and funding.
4. To promote strong linkages between the Developmental Disabilities and Aging service systems at all levels.
5. To advocate for the supports and resources needed to support older persons with mental retardation in their homes and communities.
6. To provide a diversity of educational opportunities and experiences to enhance the knowledge of people involved in the lives of older individuals with mental retardation, including the planning and development of the annual *Building Bridges Conference*.
