In the simplest sense, barbers cut and dress hair and shave and trim beards. However, they go well beyond just making people look good.



## Meet Our Newest Board Members and Staff

### **Vincent Iacono- Board Member**

Vincent Iacono was elected the new Barber Board chair following his reappointment to the Barber Board in April 2005. Mr. Iacono was born in Sicily, Italy in 1941. When he was thirteen, he immigrated to Montreal, Canada where he lived for the next decade and where he married Rosemary Tutino. Fluent in English, Italian and French, Mr. Iacono came to America. In 1970, he became a licensed barber in Pennsylvania. He has owned his own York barbershop for more than 30 years. Mr. Iacono invented the single strand hair weaving system and has done platform work for several associations including Hair International, American Hairloss Council and TDI Hair Replacement Company in California. He is a four-time recipient of the Barber of the Year award for the York Chapter of Hair International and has also received the Barber of the Year award from Hair International of Pennsylvania. Mr. Iacono is a member of the Jaycees, Queensgate Sertoma and Lions Club as well as on the advisory board for York Vocational/Technical School in York. Mr. Iacono and his wife have two children and three grandchildren.

### **Hope Goldhaber- Board Counsel**

In April 2005, Hope Goldhaber was hired as an Assistant Counsel at the Department of State and was assigned as counsel to the Barber Board and co-counsel to the Vehicle Board. Prior to her employment with the Department of State, Hope practiced labor and employment law for a year and a half at the Pennsylvania Turnpike Commission. Hope's other work experience includes employment with a personal injury law firm in Plymouth Meeting, a judicial clerkship in Stroudsburg, and the practice of labor law and education law at the Pennsylvania State Education Association in Harrisburg. Hope is looking forward to serving as Board counsel with the same high level of professionalism as that displayed by prior Board counsel, Carole Clarke. Hope is a graduate of Lehigh University with a degree in Journalism and Government and a graduate of the Temple University School of Law. Hope is married and resides in Harrisburg.

### **L. Anthony Spossey- Board Member**

Board member Anthony Spossey, commonly known as Sonny, and his wife, Carolyn, live in Washington, Pennsylvania. Mr. Spossey owns and operates Spossey's Hair Center. In addition, he is a barber teacher and works in hair replacements. Currently Mr. Spossey is the City Treasurer as well as chairman for the local Neighborhood Drug Awareness Corporation and chairman for Washington, East Washington Joint Authority. Past offices he has held have been Mayor of the City of Washington as well as a city council member. The local community has honored Mr. Spossey with several awards including Citizen of the Year awarded by Community Action Southwest CARE, Man of the Year awarded by Washington Junior Chamber of Com-

merce, Special Service Award by Knights of Columbus and Human Rights Award by NAACP.

### **Hilarene Staller- Board Administrator**

In June 2005, Hilarene Staller was selected to fill the position of Board Administrator vacated in January by Sara Sulpizio and held in the interim by Chris Butcher. Hilarene has been an employee of the Department of State for three years working in the Complaints Unit of the Legal Office where she processed complaints for all 27 boards and commissions licensed by the Department of State. Already familiar with the license tracking system and Title 49 of the Pennsylvania Code, Hilarene believes that she will be able to make the transition to the duties of a board administrator with minimal friction. Hilarene is a graduate of the University of Wisconsin with a degree in English. She is married with children and resides outside of Hummelstown.

### **Robert Vavro- Board Member**

In April 2005, Mr. Robert Vavro became a professional board member.

Mr. Vavro graduated from barber school and went to work in his father's barbershop which had been in the same location for over sixty years. He also holds a barber teacher license and has taught in barber school for three years. The Pittsburgh Barber School Alumni Association voted Mr. Vavro Barber of the Year in 1984.

Mr. Vavro has served in positions of Vice President, Recording Secretary, and Secretary-Treasurer of the Pennsylvania State Association of Journeymen Barbers. He was also the President of the Pennsylvania Barbers Credit Union.

Mr. Vavro also served as the President of the Pennsylvania Legislative Council of Organized Barbers (which represents all of the Organized Barber Groups in the State of Pennsylvania). He is also the Secretary of the Pennsylvania Cosmetology Council. Mr. Vavro served as a Proctor for the State Barber License Examinations. In May 1994, he was selected to serve on the Department of Corrections Barber/Cosmetology Advisory Committee as a Community Member.

In June 1995, Mr. Vavro was appointed by Governor Ridge to the Barber Board and served as Vice Chairman. He was also an International Vice President of the Barbers, Beauticians, Allied Industries International Association.

Mr. Vavro has resided in the community of Hazelwood (in Pittsburgh) all of his life and has been active in many community organizations. He was voted Volunteer of the Year in 2001.

## Goodbye to Sara Sulpizio

Sara Sulpizio's career has covered four decades. She has ideas about retirement, but no course of action. Her "five-wheeler" (travel trailer) is ready for the road, but she has no set destination. Sara, however, has no questions about her last message to her coworkers: "Make sure everyone knows I'm going to miss them and I enjoyed working with them."

Sara was a secretary at Harrisburg Hospital for 13 years before she began as a clerk typist at BPOA more than 25 years ago. She was appointed administrator for the Cosmetology and Barber Boards in July 1992.

"I never thought I would be a board administrator," she said from the third floor of the Penn Center building, "but I was fortunate to get the position."

Her coworkers refute her modesty.

"Sara did a great job. She worked her way up from CT 2 to board administrator, which shows a lot of determination, persistence and intelligence," BPOA Commissioner Basil Merenda said. "She did a fantastic job administering to the Barber and Cosmetology Boards."

Sara Fox, secretary for Commissioner Merenda, said Sara was a great board administrator who was very good at what she did.

"She was a joy to work with," Fox said.

After more than a quarter century of service to the state, Sara is ready to leave the stresses of her job. But her time in Harrisburg was an experience.

"It was rewarding. It's a good feeling to do a good job. It's been a challenge," she said.

Traveling will be a part of Sara's retirement, but she also plans on spending more time with friends and family, including her son Brian, stepson Roy, stepdaughter Jen and four grandchildren.

While the close of 2004 ends a chapter in Sara's life, her job is not finished when she leaves the Penn Center. Commissioner Merenda has one final directive for Sara to obey indefinitely: "Relax and smell the roses," he said.

## Welcome Deputy Secretary Marks

Peter V. Marks, Sr. was appointed Deputy Commissioner of the Bureau of Professional and Occupational Affairs by Governor Edward G. Rendell on January 31, 2005.

As Deputy Commissioner, he is primarily responsible for the day-to-day administrative oversight of the Bureau. The administrative responsibilities include Bureau staffing, budget and training. Other responsibilities include supervising Commissioner office staff, the Professional Health Monitoring Program (PHMP) as well as the Revenue Office. Deputy Marks assists the Commissioner in all relevant licensing board issues and acts as the Commissioner's designee on various boards and commissions.

Peter has served as Trustee on various Health, Welfare, Pension and Pre-Paid Legal Funds. He also functioned as lobbyist at the Pennsylvania State Legislature. Two notable successes in lobbying were the Pennsylvania Public Employee Collective Bargaining Act and the Pennsylvania Anti-Polygraph Law.

Deputy Marks has also served as Director of Organizing, Director of Education and as Director of Collective Bargaining (dealing with approximately 250 Collective Bargaining Agreements and supervising a staff of Representatives).

Peter designed and implemented a pre-paid dental program for approximately 14,000 people. He served as Arbitrator for the Philadelphia Court system and was President of the Philadelphia Municipal Court Association of Arbitrators. He has been a New Jersey Superior Court Arbitrator and Arbitrator for the United States District Court of New Jersey.

Deputy Marks is a member of the American Bar Association, Labor and Employment Law Section and the Alternative Dispute Resolution Committee.

A native of Philadelphia, Peter earned a bachelor's degree in personnel and labor relations from LaSalle University and a law degree from Delaware Law School.

Peter has eight children, 10 grandchildren and currently resides in Dauphin County.

## Disciplinary Actions

The following is a chronological listing of formal disciplinary or corrective measures taken by the board from December 2003 through August 2005. Each entry includes the name of the respondent, the respondent's address with the board, as well as the licenses and registrations that were suspended or revoked; the sanction imposed; a brief description of the basis for the disciplinary or corrective measure; and, the effective date.

Every effort has been made to ensure that the following information is correct. However, these actions and their effective dates should not be relied upon without verification from the board office. Official confirmation of the current status of a license or registration can be obtained by writing to the State Board of Barber Examiners, P.O. Box 2649, Harrisburg, PA 17105-2649.

It should be noted that the names of persons listed below may be similar to the names of persons who have not had disciplinary or corrective measures taken against them.

**Nathan R. Bookman**, license no. **BM-004842-L**, of Coatesville, Chester County, was ordered to pay a civil penalty of \$100, because Bookman failed to renew his manager-barber's license and continued to practice on an expired license. (12-15-03)

**The Racquet Club Barber Shop**, license no. **BO-017147-L**, of Philadelphia, Philadelphia County, was assessed a civil penalty of \$250 and a public reprimand was placed on the Shop's permanent Board record, because the barber shop operated without the immediate supervision of a licensed manager-barber. (12-15-03)

**Craig E. Doggett d/b/a International Styling Unisex Shop**, license nos. **BM-011482-L** and **BO-104850-L**, of Philadelphia, Philadelphia County, was ordered to

pay the original civil penalty imposed by the Hearing Examiner of \$100 as well as an additional civil penalty of \$250. In addition, a public reprimand was placed on Doggett's permanent Board record, because he violated a lawful disciplinary order of the Board and operated his barbershop on an expired/lapsed license. **Robin L. Stewart d/b/a La Robin's Nest**, license no. **BO-092326-L**, of Coatesville, Chester County, was ordered to pay a civil penalty of \$250, because Stewart failed to renew her barbershop license and continued to operate a barbershop on a lapsed license. (12-15-03)

**DeCarlo B. Freeman**, license no. **BL050105L**, of Philadelphia, Philadelphia County, was indefinitely suspended and ordered to pay a civil penalty of \$250, plus all other outstanding civil penalties for violating a lawful Board order. (12-17-03)

**Clyde E. Bosket**, license nos. **BT-000345-L**, **BM-011221-L**, **BL-035193-L**, **BO-044209-L** and **BO-432141**, of Allentown, Lehigh County, was assessed a civil penalty of \$1,000 and a public reprimand was placed on his permanent Board record, because Bosket opened and operated two separate unlicensed barber shops at two separate locations without first obtaining an inspection and approval of the facilities. **Jared Holland**, license nos. **BL-048218-L** and **BM-011103-L**, of Philadelphia, Philadelphia County, was reinstated after completing the required period of suspension. (01-23-04)

**Carey Little, Sr.**, license no. **BL-049556-L**, of Philadelphia, Philadelphia County, was suspended pursuant to the Order of the Court of Common Pleas of Philadelphia dated November 28, 2003, which the court issued under section 4355 of the Domestic Relations Code. The suspension is effective immediately. (12-22-03)

**David White**, license no. **BM-006441-L**, of Philadelphia, Philadelphia County, was suspended pursuant to the Order of the Court of Common Pleas of Philadelphia dated November 28, 2003, which the court issued under section 4355 of the Domestic Relations Code. civil penalty of \$250 and had a public reprimand placed on his permanent Board record because he violated a lawful disciplinary order of the Board. (4-19-04)

**Mark T. Nesser**, license no. **BO-098030-L**, of Pittsburgh, Allegheny County, was ordered to pay a civil penalty of \$250 because he failed to renew his shop license and continued to operate his shop on a lapsed license. (4-19-04)

**Brian Penna, d/b/a Brian's Razor's Edge**, license no. **BO-105921-L**, of Lansdale, Montgomery County, was ordered to pay a civil penalty of \$250, because Penna failed to renew his barbershop license and continued to practice on an expired/lapsed license. (4-19-04)

**Danette Bolden Ray**, no license, of Philadelphia, Philadelphia County, was ordered to pay a civil penalty of \$250 for engaging in the unlicensed practice of barbering on or about May 3, 2001. (4-19-04)

**Caldwell Harris**, license no. **BM-009781-L**, of Philadelphia, Philadelphia County, was ordered to pay a civil penalty of \$100, because Harris failed to renew his manager-barber's license and continued to practice of a lapsed or expired license from April 30, 2002 through May 16, 2003. Holden**, license no. **BM-011852-L**, of Philadelphia, Philadelphia County, was ordered to pay a \$100 civil penalty, because Holden failed to renew his manager-barber's license, No. BM-011852-L, and continued to practice while his license was lapsed from April 30, 2000 through June 14, 2002. **Rudolph Harris**, license no. **BM-009877-L**, of Philadelphia, Philadelphia County, was ordered to pay a civil penalty of \$100, because Harris failed to renew his manager-barber's license and continued to practice of a lapsed or expired license from April 30, 2002 through May 16, 2003. **Thomas E. Lauer**, license no. **BL-049244-L**, of New Freedom, York County, was ordered to pay a civil penalty of \$250, because Lauer failed to renew his barber's license and continued to practice on a lapsed or expired license from April 30, 2002 through February 7, 2003. (6-14-04)

Lisanti**, license no. **BM-002897-L and BO-048603-L**, of Avalon, Allegheny County, was ordered to pay a civil penalty of \$350 because Lisanti operated his business and continued to practice barbering from April 30, 2002 to February 7, 2003 while his licenses were expired/lapsed. **Angel Hiraldo Santos**, unlicensed, of Dauphin County, was ordered to pay a civil penalty of \$600, because Santos practiced barbering without a license; opened a barbershop without first applying for and obtaining an inspection, approval and registration of the shop; and operated an unlicensed barbershop on or about September 30, 2003. **James A. Smith**, license no. **BL-050205-L**, of Yeadon, Delaware County, had a public reprimand placed on his permanent

Board record and was order to pay a previously imposed civil penalty of \$100. Respondent also must not practice barbering until his license, no. BL-050205-L, is renewed by the Board. The Respondent practiced on an expired license and failed to respond to the citation, which was served upon him, or request a hearing. (6-14-04)

**Earl Dawson**, license no. **BM-004900-L** and **BO-046707-L** of Erie, Erie County, was ordered to pay a civil penalty of \$250, because Dawson employed an unlicensed barber to work in his shop. (08-16-04)

**Curtis Aiken and Adrian Aiken**, license no. **BO-088447-L**, of Pittsburgh, Allegheny County, were ordered to pay a civil penalty of \$500, because they failed to renew their barber shop license and continued to operate their shop from April 30, 1996 through September 19, 2002, while their license was expired (08-16-04).

**Anthony Michael Argento**, license no. **BL-048519-L**, of York, York County, was placed on probation for two years upon reactivation for engaging in unethical or dishonest practices or conduct and conviction of two felonies. (10-19-04)

**Michael J. Parrish**, license no. **BL-050068-L**, of Philadelphia, Philadelphia County, was assessed a \$100 civil penalty for practicing as a barber while his license was expired. (10-19-04)

**Henry Schley**, license nos. **BL-036115-L** and **BO-031683-L**, of Philadelphia, Philadelphia County, was assessed a \$250 civil penalty for aiding and abetting the unlicensed practice of barbering. (10-19-04)

**Bennie Sheppard**, license no. **BO-093001-L**, of Philadelphia, Philadelphia County, was revoked for failing to comply with the shop equipment requirements. (10-19-04)

**Ernest R.
