50th National Interstate Council of State Boards of Cosmetology

Board member Dianna Orndorff attended the 50th National Interstate Council of State Boards of Cosmetology (NIC) Annual Conference August 27 – 29, 2005, in Washington D.C. There were board members from 32 states in attendance and over the course of the conference, there were seminars on the following subjects: Airbrush Tanning Safety & Sanitation; Pedicure Spa Sanitation; Regulating Tattooing; Milady & Pivot Point book updates; O.S.H.A. Salon Health & Safety issues; and legislative updates.

However, the biggest concern during the conference was the subject of reciprocity, which would give licensees greater mobility in moving from state to state. Meetings of this nature, with representatives from the regulatory bodies from many states, help provide a better grasp of what is expected of regulators. NIC has looked beyond the U.S. borders in order to enhance its understanding of reciprocity and related problems, and in so doing, has joined forces with the International Cosmetology Licensing Organization (ICLO), whose membership consists of the United States, Canada, United Kingdom, New Zealand, South Korea, and Australia.

One aspect of this issue is the problem of licensees crossing state lines and working illegally according to one state's laws, requiring enforcement dollars, which in the Commonwealth come out of the licensees' pockets as licensure fees, to be spent prosecuting those individuals despite the fact that they hold a valid license in another state. A related concern lies in the possibility that the federal government could pass a law to make some sort of national licensure happen, taking the matter out of individual boards' hands. An alternative would be to create a national endorsement, rather than national license, so each state would still regulate its own licensees but reciprocity would be simplified.

During the conference, Ms. Orndorff was appointed Region 2 Director of NIC. Being in this position will help the Board keep up with ongoing changes within the industry all across the United States and will keep the lines of communication open with other states. The Board and its counterparts across the county have continuing work to do to protect the health, safety and welfare of the public. Networking at conferences like this helps the boards do a better job of such protection.

8th International Esthetics, Cosmetics & Spa Conference

Board member Kimberly Nesmith attended the 8th International Esthetics, Cosmetics & Spa Conference (IECSC) October 29-30, 2005, in Orlando, Florida. The conference focused on the most innovative aesthetic trends and technologies. There were about 330 exhibits, a Medical Spa Pavilion, and 75 educational presentations, including a general session, manufacturers' classes, business summits, make-up workshops, post-conference advanced educational workshops, and a Medical Spa Summit held two days prior to the conference. There were 11,185 individuals in attendance and 5 countries were represented.

Educational workshops touched on subjects such as permanent make-up, eyelash extensions, and cellular rejuvenation, which covered various emerging techniques. Additionally, the business summit reviewed financial programs, promotions and their importance, personalized motivational programs, and advertising.

Ms. Nesmith notes that the conference program demonstrated that medical spa treatments are rapidly advancing, with the types of equipment used sometimes delivering extreme results. For example, microdermabrasion machines remove the epidermis on the face and micronized currents send small amounts of electricity through the skin. Such techniques and equipment raise the possibility of emergency reactions, and with those concerns come questions about whether cosmetology professionals are prepared to respond adequately to emergencies. In the Commonwealth, there has not yet been a determination as to whether or not such techniques and equipment may be used by cosmetology licensees without the participation or supervision of a physician or other health care professional, so these services may be under close watch to ensure the safety of the public.

Cosmetology Educators of America 11th Annual Convention

In July 2005, Board Chair Susan Rineer attended the Cosmetology Educators of America (CEA) Annual Convention in Las Vegas from July 22 to 25, 2005. The convention started Friday night, July 22, 2005, with a movie screening of One Life Project. This is about how our community works together to help each other in a time of need.

Throughout each day of the convention, there were many different educational sessions on subjects from How to Live a Better Life to Revolutionizing the Client Experience. Saturday started with an educational breakfast with John DiJulius, a motivational speaker. Sunday's sessions addressed skincare, haircolor, nailcare, creating desire, discipline, and direction. Monday dealt with legal and liability issues, encouraging national endorsement through examinations, and preparing students for licensure exams. There were also sessions dealing with clipper cutting and how to inspire students to achieve. Each meal had speakers that gave insight into student motivation and how to help students achieve professionalism.

The Board Chair spent time networking with instructors from other states to find out some of their problems and received information on how they deal with issues. She did not get a chance to meet any board chairs from other states, but spent a great deal of time sharing ideas. The convention was a fantastic opportunity to learn about other states and their problem-solving systems that could be adapted for use in Pennsylvania.

Apprentice Hours

This is a reminder to cosmetology shops training cosmetologist apprentices. According to the Board's regulations at § 7.134, the owner of a cosmetology shop that employs apprentices shall submit to the Board, on a form provided by the Board, a quarterly report of the hours earned by each apprentice. The reports shall be submitted by the following dates: April 15, July 15, October 15 and January 15.

According to the regulations at § 43b.5, Schedule of civil penalties, failure to send such reports to the Board is a violation under Act 48. The first offense is \$100. The second offense is \$250.

If your shop has an apprentice, please be sure to send in quarterly reports to the Board office.
